6. Director's Report and Circulation

Building Maintenance

- HVAC repair is scheduled for Wednesday, February 23, 2022.
- Carpets will be cleaned on Friday, April 15, 2022.
- Shingles are missing from the shed and it is causing damage/leaks
- Met with Trustee Ditter regarding some modifications to outdoor spaces to make them more usable for outdoor programs.
- Discussion to purchase an air purifier for the meeting room (Schwartz Grant Funding)
- We will be redecorating and reorganizing the children's section and would very much welcome assistance

Collection Department

- To improve the circulation of Young Adult materials, Children's Librarian Karin Roslund has worked with the rest of the staff to relocate materials in spaces that would provide easier access and greater visibility. The Young Adult Collection will now be located in the area that was once the Children's Used Book Sale area, which will now be stored in the area where the Young Adults books were.
- Magazines will also be relocated for greater visibility.
- Meeting minutes and borough binders will now be located along the far wall.

Meetings/Conferences and Training

• Staff continues to utilize webinars for professional development.

Friends/Fundraising

- The Chocolate Strawberry Fundraiser Raised \$625. They made 66 boxes of chocolate-covered strawberries!!!
- The next fundraiser will be an in-house raffle.
- The Friends of the Dunellen Public Library Farmers' Market opening day is Sunday, April 10, 2022, at their new venue in Washington Park.
- The Friend's next meeting in March is TBD Please consider attending and please consider volunteering for one of the Sunday markets.

Grants/Donations

- A grant application for the Dollar Tree Foundation in collaboration with the Middlesex County College was submitted that would allow us to offer an ESL class, as opposed to the conversation cafe we currently offer.
- The library was awarded a \$2,875 grant to continue cultural programming from the county.
- iPads will be arriving from the NJ Health Connect program, we should adopt a policy for their circulation and use.
- A grant committee could allow us to broaden the scope of the grants we apply for and increase grant funding.

Programs

- CHILDREN'S: Virtual storytime videos are being submitted by community leaders and staff
 to be premiered throughout the year. Sydney McLaughlin and Congresswoman Bonnie
 Watson Coleman have agreed to film for us but we have not received them yet. Videos will be
 uploaded to the library's YouTube page and premiered at appropriate times of the year.
 Trustees are invited to participate and nominate others to submit videos.
- Board of Education member Faith Thompson presented a Lunar New Year Storytime and craft as an in-person activity.

- The grassy outdoor area at the American Legion is available for us to use for storytime and will be utilized for outdoor programs in the Spring.
- TEENS: Gaming clubs have been very popular. We are looking to add a second Dungeons & Dragons campaign. The Anime Club is meeting every Friday, in person.
- We will be offering a college resource program (virtual) for families with high school students.
- Adult programs will host a first-time home buyers program in March that will be virtual and in person.
- Crochet Club and Book Club are meeting in person regularly.
- The ESL Conversation Cafe is being facilitated by Library Assistant Lara Perez-Curran. Additional funding is necessary to continue to offer this program, which is the most widely requested program.
- On Thursday, February 24, 2022, the library will host an after-hours event featuring a Jazz Trio.

Community Outreach

- Middlesex County and OEM established a Covid vaccine clinic at the library this past month.
- Children/Teen programs will collaborate with DACC (Dunellen Arts & Culture Commission) to host a miniature art show. Submissions in the form of media limited to 10x10 inches will be collected throughout March and will be featured at an opening reception towards the end of the month, the date and time will be determined at a later date.
- A representative from Elijah's Promise will be at the library the week of February 22, 2022 to assist individuals with the process of applying for SNAP benefits.
- It may be beneficial to explore the possibility of acquiring a grant to have a social worker available occasionally. We are encountering many individuals seeking assistance that begins as reference questions but shifts to something that is beyond the scope of what we can provide or are trained to respond to. Staff are working to compile information and resources and identify local organizations that are better suited to assist in this area. Mayor's representative Councilwoman Trina Rios has been very helpful in this area.

Information and Technology

- Computer proposals from Linx8 to be reviewed
- There is a significant need in our community for additional internet access for virtual meetings. If we were able to circulate hot spots it would be very helpful for many patrons, especially when used with the iPads we will have available for telehealth appointments.
- With the absence of available public phones, we have seen an increase in requests to use our phone. Having a phone available as a resource may be helpful to some of our patrons.
